DONATION GUIDELINES 2019

Items in good condition are welcome but the following CANNOT be accepted (Not an exclusive list)

- **Hazardous materials**
 - paint/stain, herbicide, pesticide, construction material, household cleaners, glass, automotive parts, medications
- **Electronic/appliances**
 - batteries, cell phones, computers/monitors, televisions, microwave ovens, large appliances
- **Furniture**
 - large/heavy items (sofas, etc.), mattresses/box springs, blinds/drapes, ceiling fans
- **Books & Prints**
 - encyclopedias, magazines and textbooks
 - *Most welcome book donations:* cookbooks, children's books, hard cover or large format coffee table and best sellers, paperback novels
- **Perishables**
 - Food, cosmetics
- **Children Items**
 - Strollers, cribs, high chairs, car seats

- **Other**

- Exercise machines, skis, etc., weapons/ammunition, broken or strained items, home burnt CDs & videos (copyrighted material)

Start Smart - A FREE Teen Driver Safety Class

Do you have a teen driver in your family? Help them to “start smart.” Central Marin Police Authority (CMPA) is pleased to partner with the California Highway Patrol’s Marin Office and offer the Start Smart class to our communities. Start Smart is a FREE two-hour traffic safety class designed specifically for teen drivers or soon-to-be drivers (15 to 19 years of age) and their parents. The class will teach teens about some of the most common mistakes that new drivers make, and the most common reasons that law enforcement officers will contact them while driving. The class also serves to educate parents and clarify some of the confusion about the laws regarding provisional drivers licensing.

At least one parent or guardian must attend with their teen. (exception for Court referrals over 18 years old)

What is HHW?

Common household items such as fluorescent bulbs, batteries, gasoline, household chemicals, pesticides, paints, antifreeze and asbestos are all considered HHW. These items can be toxic to you and/or the environment and must be disposed of properly to protect you, the environment and your resource hauler. Learn more at Zero Waste
